Steil seeks your input on Trump

Congressman sends out
impeachment survey

How do you feel about
impeachment proceedings
against President Trump?
U.S. Rep. Bryan Steil,
R-Wis., wants to know.

The first-term congressman from the 1st District, which includes Kenosha County, released an online survey on Friday asking constituents if they support articles of impeachment against Trump.

The yes-or-no question is followed by a registration form and eight-question survey, which addresses topics such as job approval, border security, federal spending, health care and taxes.
